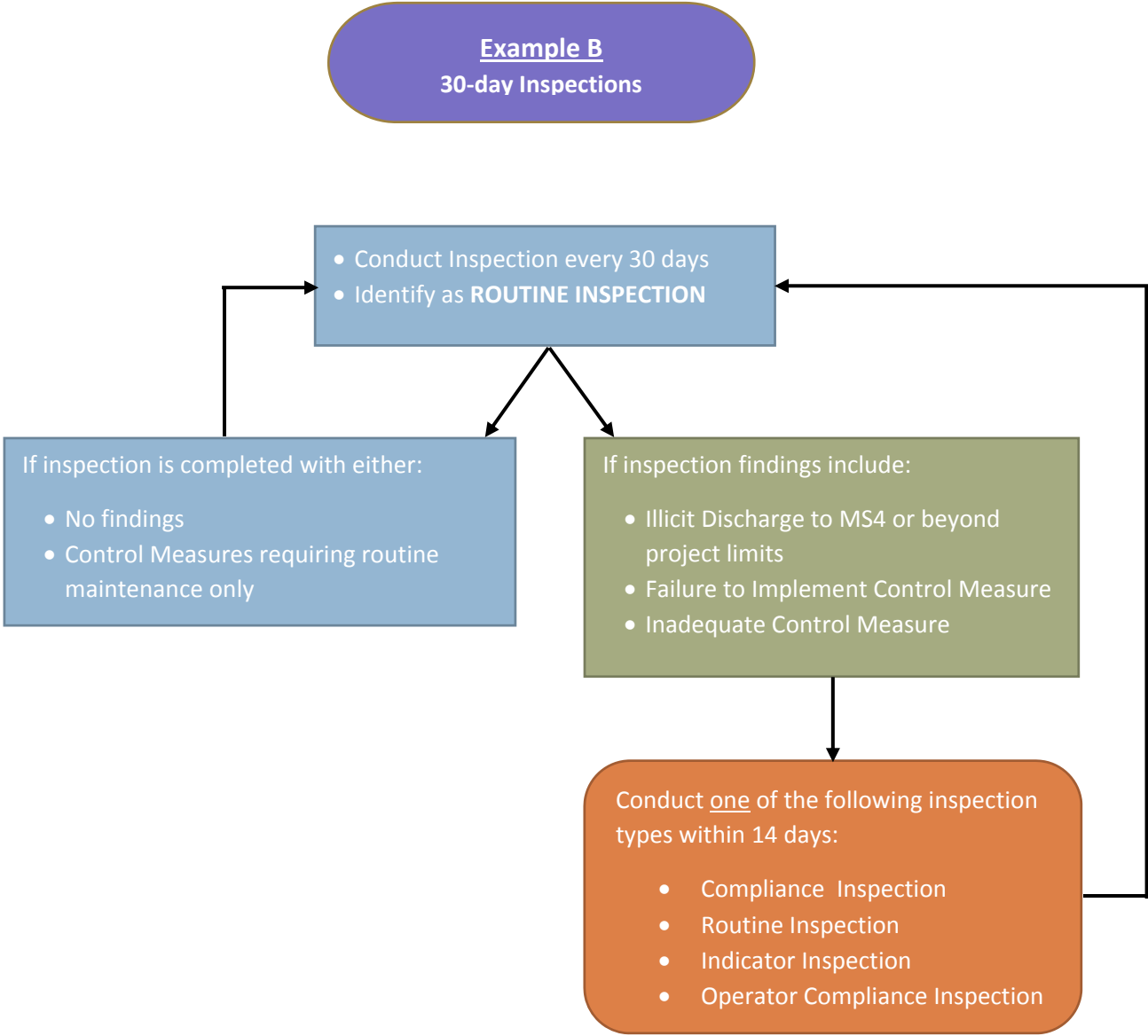
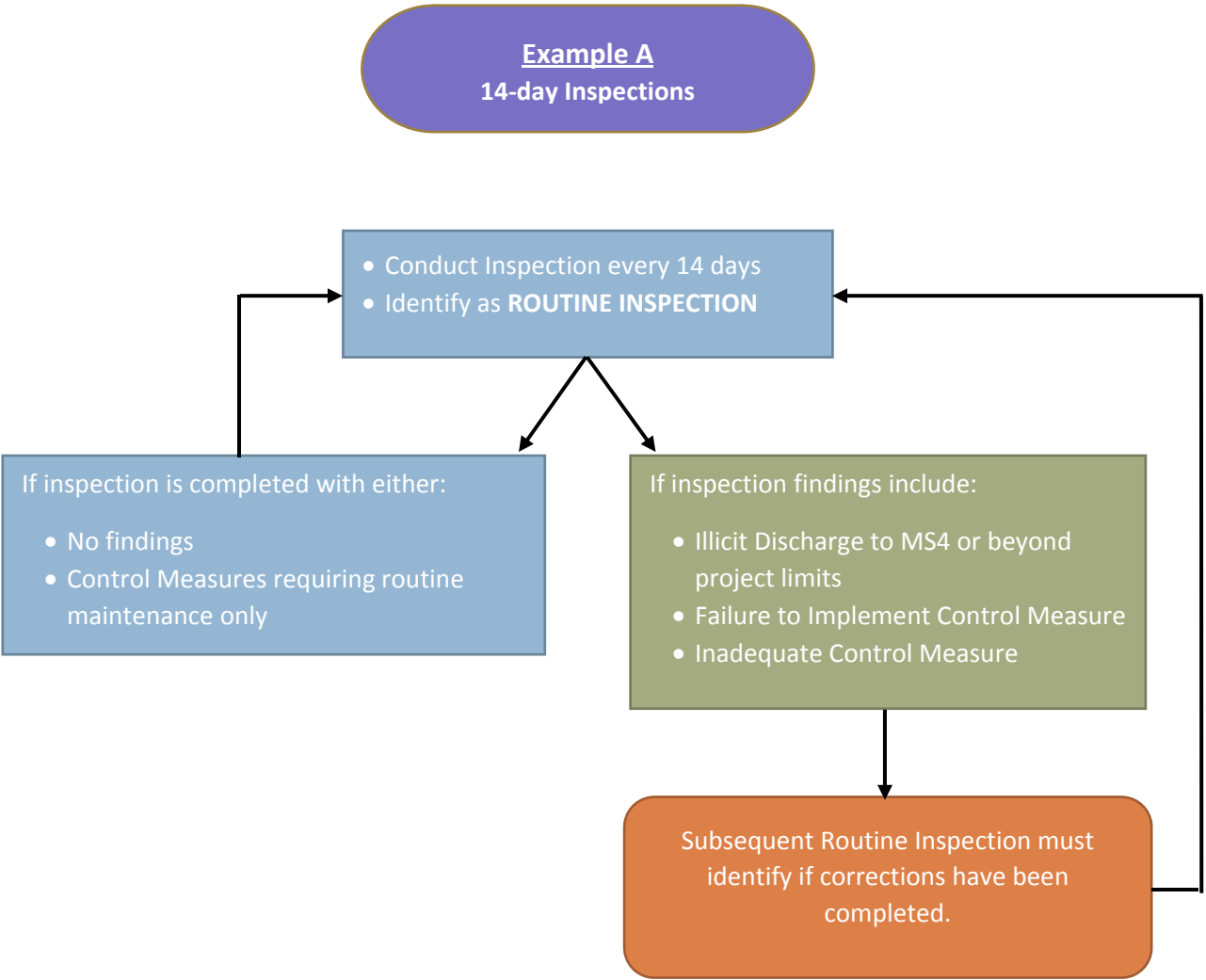


Construction Inspection Program examples

The purpose of this document is to provide example construction program structures that would be compliant with the MS4 Phase II Permit. The Permit affords additional flexibility beyond the examples provided below, as well as combinations of inspection types, but not every scenario could be considered here. Please refer to Part I.E.3.a.vi. of the COR090000 Permit or I.E.3.c.vi. of the COR080000 Permit for specific information regarding the scope and recordkeeping requirements for each inspection type. The Construction Program applies to construction activities including land disturbance. Therefore, it is expected that inspections will begin upon land disturbance which is typically initiated by the issuance of a Grading Permit, MS4 issued Water Quality Permit, verification of CDPS, etc.



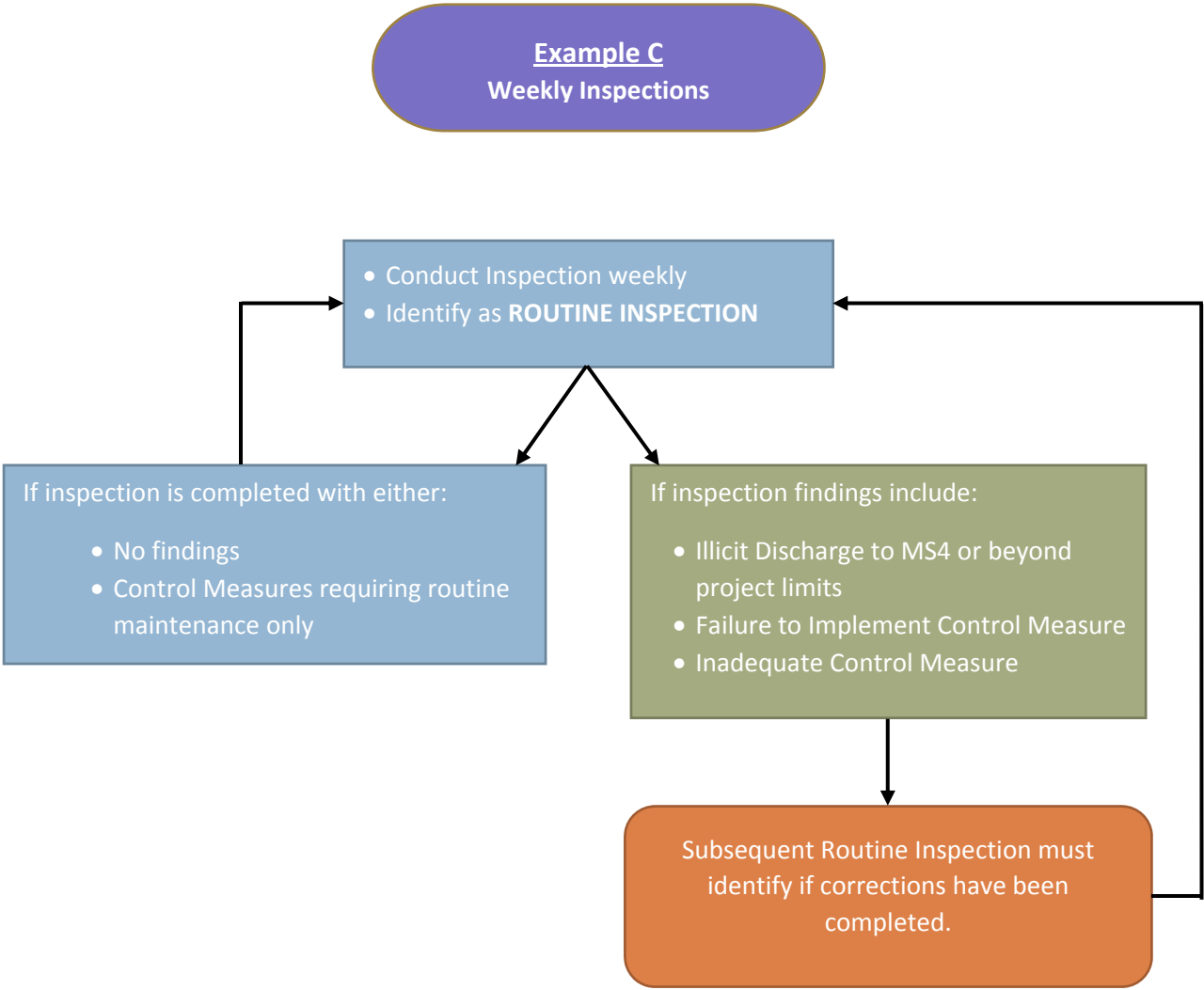

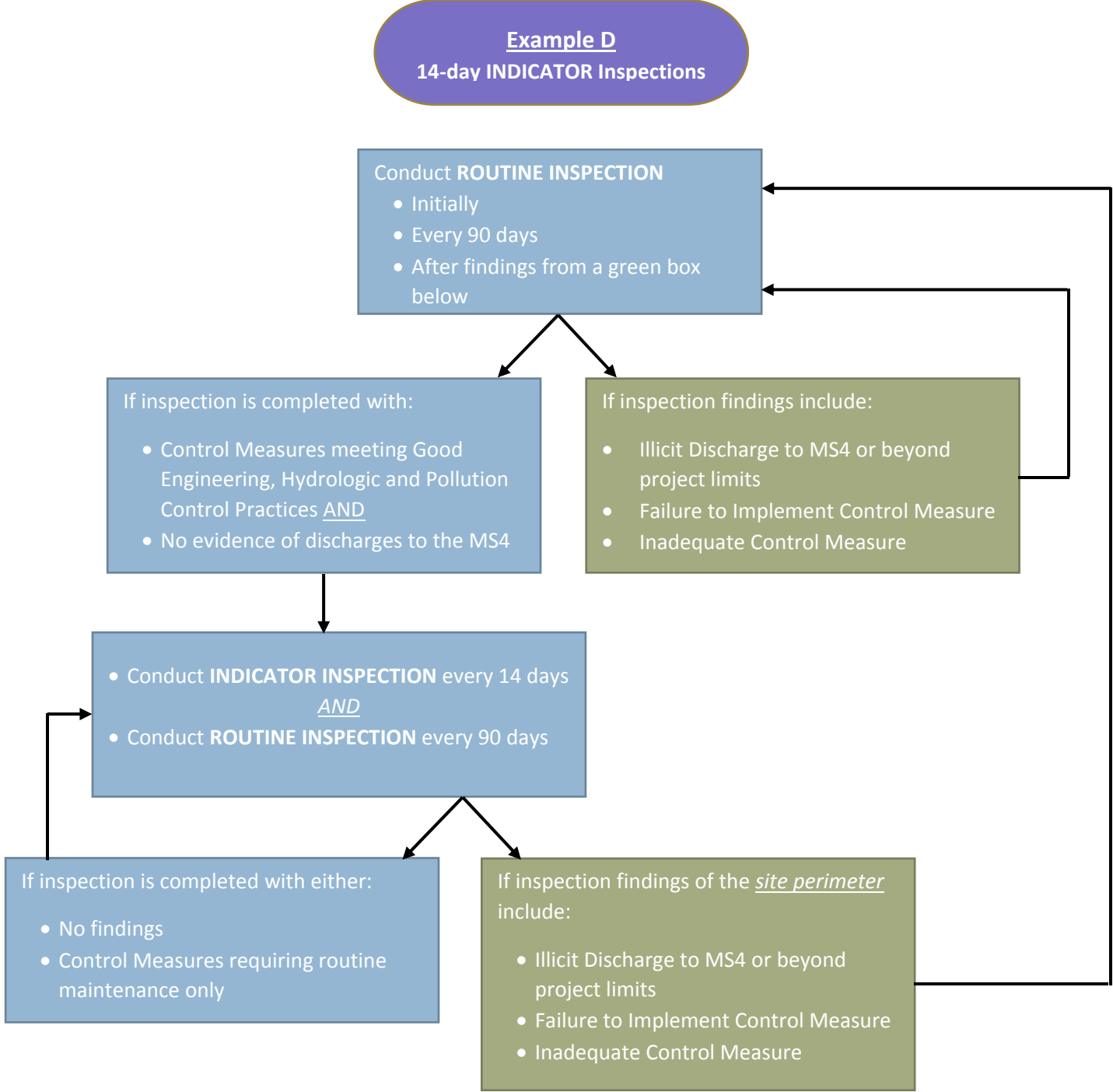
